

## EHS PE and Sport Premium 2021 – 22

The Primary School PE and Sport Premium funding is used to increase the quality and variety of Physical Education, Sport and Physical Activity (PESPA) offer. Also, it contributes to building capacity and capability within the school staff to lead activities PESPA when needed confidently. The impact is recorded below. Schools are free to choose how to do this. We base our range of activities on the requirements of the National Curriculum for PE, the provision of a broad and balanced curriculum and the need to personalise high quality provision for the diverse needs in our setting.

Primary sports and PE expenditure	Cost	Impact assessment - comment
Capital Kids Cricket Coach	£4320	Students had access to high quality teaching of varied sports in small groups/one-to-one. They had supported to improve skills, techniques and team work in a hospital setting. Capital Kids Cricket Coaches are experienced with working hospital schools. They increase the engagement of pupils in regular physical activity (one day a week) on the wards and the classrooms. They offer the opportunity to develop competence in a broad experience of a range of adapted sports and activities, such as cricket, bowling, petanque, curling, volleyball and other. These lessons supported students with fine and gross motor skills and ensure they remain active.
Dance Coaches	£970	We worked with a dance coach Royal Academy of Dance with their RADiate programme, engaging children of pupils in regular physical activity, improving their wellbeing, coordination and fine motor skills. We had online lessons one day a week in the Spring Term and the Summer Term. Different members of the staff worked closely with the coach to increase their confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching dance. Children experienced a wide range of dance activities and movements.
Equipment & Resources	£1343	We invested in the use of the equipment to maintain safety and quality standards in all the different PESPA activities, ensuring the inclusion of all ages and abilities and SEND. These were used to compliment home-school learning goals supporting children with medical and physical needs to engage in activities and learning. Providing access to activities regardless of their medical needs.
CPD	£690	We purchased a subscription for cross curricular Maths and PE resources: <a href="https://www.youthsporttrust.org/active-maths">https://www.youthsporttrust.org/active-maths</a> to support the Maths subject lead on exploring a more cross curricular Maths curriculum, providing access to activities and learning opportunities.
Indoor gym play equipment	£2604	For PE sports and dance and purchase of indoor activity gym.
Unspent budget	£6377	The primary classroom remained closed by the hospital due to the pandemic and its restrictions to mixing. Unspent funds will be retained in this budget for spending in the next academic year.
