

EHS PE and Sport Premium 2022 – 23

The Primary School PE and Sport Premium funding is used to increase the quality and variety of Physical Education, Sport and Physical Activity (PESPA) offer. Also, it contributes to building capacity and capability within the school staff to lead activities PESPA when needed confidently. The impact is recorded below. Schools are free to choose how to do this. We base our range of activities on the requirements of the National Curriculum for PE, the provision of a broad and balanced curriculum and the need to personalize high quality provision for the diverse needs in our setting.

Primary sports and PE expenditure	Cost	Impact assessment - comment
Capital Kids Cricket coach	£3,067	Capital Kids Cricket is a youth development charity that uses cricket to overcome societal challenges and empower young people. Their coaches are very experienced working in hospital school settings, and are therefore able to deliver a programme of activities to ensure maximum engagement and progress for children with medical needs. Working one day a week with pupils in the classroom and on the wards, the coaches are able to increase pupil participation in regular physical activity through encouraging engagement in a broad experience of a range of adapted sports and activities, such as cricket, bowling, petanque, curling, seated volleyball, chair basketball and others. Sessions are personalised to meet the individual needs of pupils, including those with SEND. Analysis demonstrates that children make excellent progress in each area of PE covered, and pupils and parents / carers offer positive feedback in surveys carried out throughout the year.
RADiate (Royal Academy of Dance)	£1,225	The RADiate programme (from the Royal Academy of Dance) provide subsidised inclusive dance classes with specialised Dance Artists, to children with additional learning needs. The sessions aim to engage children and young people through dance, movement, music and sensory props to develop their physicality and boost their self-esteem. The sessions are created in response to the needs of individual children, to ensure maximum engagement and progression. These sessions enable children with medical needs, especially those with SEND, to engage in regular physical activity, improving their well-being, coordination and motor skills. Our analysis shows a high-level of engagement in dance sessions, especially from learners with SEND. Surveys results show a high level of satisfaction with the sessions from parents / carers and staff.
Capoeira	£800	Capoeira is another tool we use to increase participation in regular physical activity; this is a fun and inclusive means of enabling different learners to engage. Capoeira movements involve the entire body; they develop strength and increase flexibility and are also great for developing coordination.
Bollywood Dance	£1,050	As part of our celebration of Diwali and diversity we organised a Bollywood dance workshop. Kalpesh from K'Z Dance Entertainment UK organized a dance workshop for all our students and staff. Also, to celebrate the end of the academic year and our sports week In July 2023 K'Z organized a workshop with our long-term students.

SEND Resources	£1,898	To make it inclusive for all our students in our school we have invested in sports equipment for our SEND students. Staff have had training on the equipment and how to use it to enable engagement and participation from learners with SEND.
Chess in School and Communities	£2,200	We introduced chess across the school as a way of ensuring engagement with a wider range of pupils. Chess is a universal game, knowing no boundaries of age, gender, faith, ethnicity or disability, that promotes key intellectual skills such as problem-solving, logical thinking, pattern recognition and concentration. It also supports better attainment in maths and increases self-esteem and resilience. Staff have had training in delivering chess sessions and we are able to offer chess sessions to many pupils each week. Chess in Schools and Communities provide us with a regular chess tutor to deliver sessions every week.
Paralympian visit Youth Sport Trust Autumn 2022	£515	Athlete mentor Kate Gray from Youth Sports Trust visited our school and had an inspirational session with our students across the school via live stream and met pupils in person. This session was designed to inspire our pupils and to encourage appropriate engagement in physical activities.
Paralympian Visit from Sports for Champions Summer 2023	£750	Callum Deboys from Sports for Champions visited our school in July 2023 and our pupils had an amazing and incredible experience, inspired by his own experience.
Shooting Stars (circus skills)	£1,800	Activities will provide students with the opportunity to learn a variety of skills such as Hula Hooping, Spinning Poi, Juggling, Flower sticks, and Poi. Adapted for the age group, pupils will focus on developing their fine and gross motor skills whilst having fun. Practice makes perfect, and in this program, we encourage students to never give up, try something new and challenge their hand-eye coordination with these fun activities.
Chinese Lion Dance workshop	£718	As part of our Chinese New Year celebration, we invited Primary Workshops for Schools to organize Chinese Lion Dance Workshop. This enabled a wide range of pupils to engage with physical activity.
Coronation dance workshop	£499	To celebrate King's coronation Primary workshop for schools organized a dance workshop which enabled a wide range of pupils to engage with physical activity.
Cultural and diversity week	£160	Cultural and diversity week enhances our curriculum so that it builds on existing work to broaden up understanding of what is most outstanding about people's contribution to different cultures. A Caribbean dancer delivered an amazing dancing experience showing her Caribbean tradition clothes and taught pupils a variety of traditional Caribbean dance moves.
Equipment & Resources	£5,670	We invested in the upkeep of the equipment to maintain safety and quality standards in all the different PESPA activities, ensuring the inclusion of all ages and abilities and SEND. Long-term pupils were provided with a PE home learning pack, with equipment of their choice. This pack will allow the children to be active and engaged in physical activity outside the school timetable and to remain active.
CPD science workshop "Hands On"	£1,050	Healthy Bodies, Skeleton and muscles. These sessions promoted healthy lifestyle in lessons other than PE. These workshops motivated children to do their best.
